REPORT ON THE WORK OF THE FOUNDATION FOR THE PERIOD FROM APRIL 2019 - MARCH 2020

The Foundation faced big challenge during the year 2019/2020 respecting to the social resistance since June 2019 and the COVID-19 pandemic all over the world in January 2020. Most of our planned outdoor activities and regular programs had urged to be postponed and even called off.

With the serving objective to the community, the Foundation continuous dedicated offering various kinds of services and education to the community related to liver health. Though funding and resources continued to be the biggest longstop in our operation, the Foundation would never been hinder by any hardship and would strike to intensify our task to serve the community in different dimensions.

I) PUBLIC EDUCATION ACTIVITIES & SERVICES

1. Liver Donation Campaign

Being a continuous support and contribution in promoting liver health and organ donation organization, the foundation dedicated to raise people's awareness of "liver donation "save life" concept. Our mission is deemed to remind people the crucial issue whenever chances arose. It is concerns for the interest of the end-stage liver patients who much undergo liver transplant for survival, is one of our core object.

<u>Ceremony of the Organ Donation Day 2019</u> and 50th anniversary of First Kidney Transplant inHong Kong

The foundation had been invited and the representative, Ms Lilian Leung had attended the above said event on 9 November 2019 at 2:30pm which was organized by the Food and Health Bureau, the Department of Health and the Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK). One of the guests – Prof. Sophia Chan shared the history of organ transplant in Hong Kong. Celebrities and post-transplant patients conducted meaningful and touching performance during the ceremony.



2. Hepatitis Vaccination Program

This is one of our routine services for people of Hong Kong who were willing to protect themselves against hepatitis A and hepatitis B infection. The new application had been resumed for injection on 23^{rd} October 2019. The Foundation could only offer the childhood doses with 2-in-1 injection (10mcg 0.5ml instead of 20mcg) for this period of time due to the shortage of vaccines for adult from the supplier of GSK. New price quotations for the vaccines from GSK with price adjustment as follows : Hep A – HK\$1,200 (2 doses) / costs incurred : @HK\$413.00/shot – Tier (3) 7+4 Hep B – HK\$750 (3 doses) / costs incurred : @HK\$155.72/shot – Tier (3) 30+12

The nursing service of injection conducted by Worldwide Private Nursing Services Ltd and the administer fee remain unchanged - HK\$1,030 (mini 3 hours service)

For this period, 3 participants had taken part in the injection for Hepatitis A and 23 participated for Hepatitis B. Due to the COVID-19, the scheduled injection in January had been suspended. For February, it could have been resumed with the great assistance by one of our Foundation members - Dr. John Leung whom he conducted the injection at his clinic (Access Medical Diagnostic & Laboratory Centre) at East Point Centre. The injection in March had been carried out at Foundation office. Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Foundation had withheld the 'new application' of this program since end March 2020.

This service had been put on hold for the period due to the social resistance and COVID-19. It may hopefully be resumed by second half of 2020


5. Community Service Program for Hepatitis B Carriers


This service "Community Service Project for HBV+" had been starting since March 2018 with 1000 quota. The Foundation aimed to serve Hong Kong Citizens who had confirmed as a Hepatitis B carriers and had not performed any of the liver function tests in the past one year. Participants were offered initially "one free" blood test and doctor consultation (at the first consultation only). We had teamed up 6 volunteer doctors from members of H&E and Research Committees to kick off this program, they are as follow :




Distribution of participants from 1 April 2019 to 31 March 2020:

6. Meeting with Liver Specialists Patient Gathering Sessions

This activity had been suspended for this period of time due to the social resistance and COVID-19.

7. World Hepatitis Day

World Hepatitis Day 2019 was on 28th July 2019, it aimed to bring the world together to raise the awareness of global burden of viral hepatitis. People living with hepatitis world eventually die because of the negligence. With better awareness and proper understanding, many of these deaths could be avoided

In response to the World Hepatitis Day, the Foundation had organized and wellprepared an activity in named of "2030 杜絕肝炎" located at Lok Fu Plaza. Nevertheless, due to the social resistance and for safety to the public, this activity had urged to be cancelled.

The incurred costs were HK\$38,859.07 in total including an advertisement / backdrop / T-shirts, stickers / Prizes & souvenirs for booths / Souvenirs for guests / Security Service.

8. Health Talk

Due to the social resistance and COVID-19, for safety reason to the public, the Foundation had to postpone this activity. It may hopefully be resumed by second half of 2020.

1. Liver Buddies patient support group

a) Simon K Y Lee Memorial Scholarship



The 9th Scholarship 2019 was awarded to 8 out of 13 applications this year. The scholarship presentation had been held on 21 December 2019 at the Christmas party located at Queen Mary Hospital. Successful candidates were excited to receive the appreciation the Scholarship of HK\$2,000 each from the Foundation Chairman Ms. Mildred Law and Dr. Chok Siu Ho except one was absent on that day. The leftover scholarship fund is HK\$40,000.

b) Christmas Party 2019

It was a celebration event for liver transplant recipients to rejoice their gift of life and a promotional activity for appeal of liver donation. This annual function was held on Saturday, 21 December 2019 at Block K2 at Queen Mary Hospital.



19 members of Liver Buddies, accompanied by their family members, friends and relatives totally 42 guests, attended the activity and expressed their delightful toward the gift of life. Dr. Mak Long Yi & Dr. James Fung entertained during the party with piano, guitar and Christmas songs. We appreciated for the members of Lions Club whom they assisted the game session. 2. Liver Care patient support group

The Foundation had offered annual health check program in September 2019 for eligible group members who submitted annual subscription of HK\$50.00. The coupon had been sent together with the newsletter in end September this year provided that the members of the group a channel to receive proper health information. It was one of the most welcome activities for the group. Membership renewal reminder had been sent out in mid Jan and end Mar 2020 respectively. 128 Liver Care members had renewed their membership for the year of 2020 upto end March 2020.

III) RESEARCH PROJECTS

The Population-based study on seroprevalence of viral hepatitis in Hong Kong

With the first largest population territory-based study done in Hong Kong for last two years, it had been confirmed that HBV had remained a common disease in Hong Kong as well as the effectiveness of universal HBV vaccination. The significant task is to call for raising public awareness of chronic HBV and screening since it had been revealed that almost half of patients with HBV were unaware of their disease status.

Referred to the fore comprehensive findings and analysis of the research of viral hepatitis with the identified 800 patients, the follow up result could be make use of the patients' perceptions for the future policy making and the cases monitoring.
